The Turning Point Public Health Statute Modernization Collaborative and the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation have requested the *Center for Law and the Public's Health* to systematically track state legislative bills relating to the subject matter of the TURNING POINT MODEL STATE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT. This information is regularly updated through the <u>Turning Point Act State Legislative Table</u>. As summarized therein, from January 1, 2003 to August 15, 2007, thirty-three (33) states have introduced one-hundred and thirty-three (133) legislative bills or resolutions that are based upon or feature provisions that either used actual language from the TURNING POINT ACT, or are based on some part of its subject matter. Forty-eight (48) of these bills have passed.

The extent to which the Act's provisions were incorporated into each state's laws varies. The table below denotes the state legislative areas that relate to major sections or corresponding themes in the Turning Point Act. For the purposes of the table, symbols have the following meanings:

- □ indicates that a bill or resolution has been introduced
- indicates that a bill or resolution has been passed
- **X** symbol indicates that a bill or resolution has been vetoed.

Please note -- this table only tracks the subject matter of recently passed or pending legislative bills, not existing state legislative provisions. As well, the table does not generally include legislative bills closely resembling the Center's MODEL STATE EMERGENCY HEALTH POWERS ACT (MSEHPA) [though some of the MSEHPA's provisions are included in the TURNING POINT ACT].
